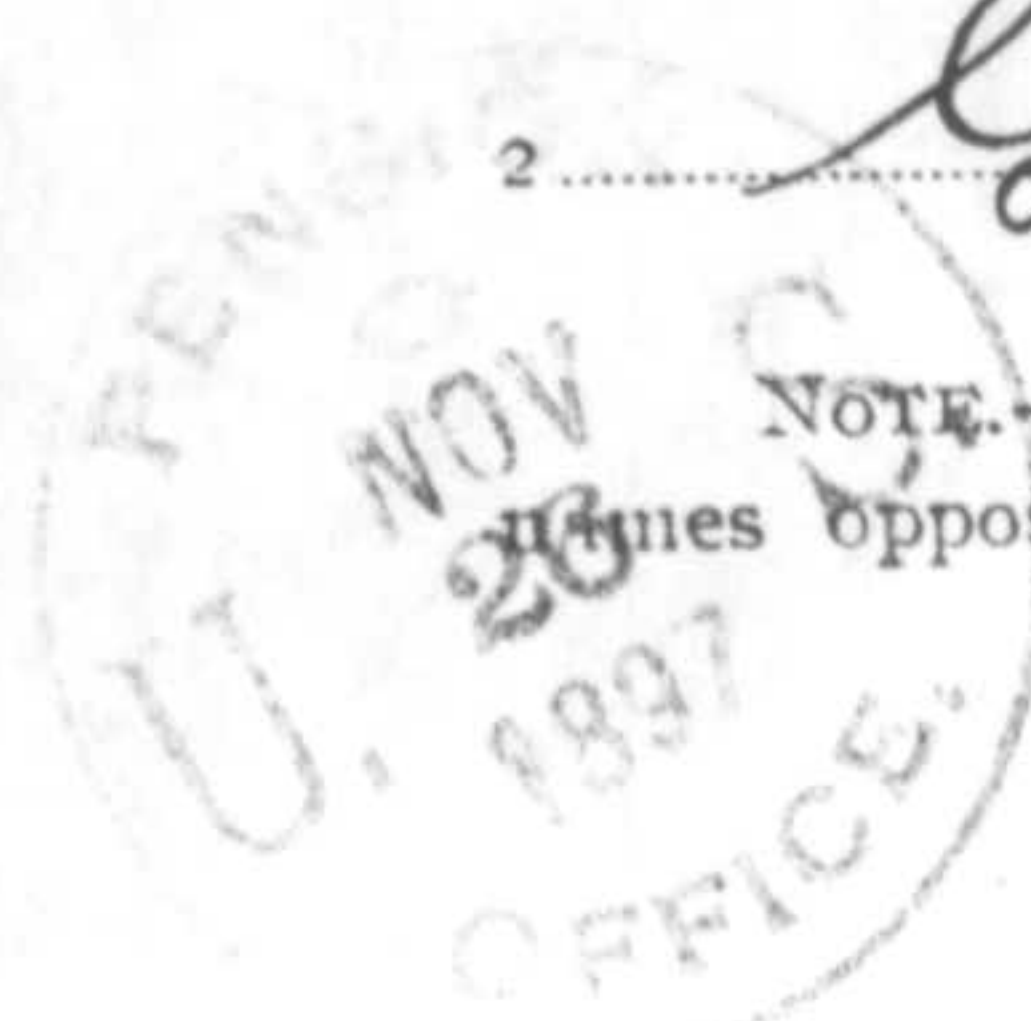
well known to me to be reputable and entitled to credit, and who, being duly sworn, declare in relation to
