SIR:

I have the honor to acknowledge the receipt of your request of February 21, 1881, for certain information for use in the consideration of application for pension No. 323,392, and to return it herewith with the following information:

It appears from the records of this Office that Frederick C. Jarr, accepted appointment as Captain and A. A. G. of Vols. October 7, 1862. He served as A. A. G. of the post of Harper's Ferry, Va. from sometime in the latter part of 1862, until March 1863; A. A. G. 1st Brigade, 1st Divⁿ 1st Corps to July, 1863; 3^d Brigade, 3^d Divⁿ 1st Corps, Army of Potomac, to December, 1863, and 2nd Brigade, 3^d Divⁿ 1st Corps, Army, Potomac - to February 13, 1864.

On leave of absence - not sick leave - until March 12, 1864, when he accepted commission as Major and Additional Paymaster, and served as such in the Pay District of Virginia - and North Carolina, until November 1, 1865, when mustered out, his services being no longer needed. No record of disability and no certificate on file.
