I have the honor to acknowledge the receipt of your request of July 21st, 1881, for certain information for use in the consideration of application for pension No. 323,391, and to return it herewith, with the following information from the records of this office:

It appears from the rolls, &c., on file in this office that Frederick C. Jan. was mustered into the service of the United States as 1st Lieut. Co. D. 1st Regiment of Maryland Vols., to date May 16th, 1861, to serve _____ years, or during the war. On the Muster-roll of Company _____ of that Regiment for the months of July & Aug. 1861 & subsequent rolls to Aug. 31st, 1862, he is reported as Deceased Service. Adjutant of the Regiment.

Regtal Return for June 1862, "About as near Casualty that shows severe wound at Front Royal Va. May 23rd 1862. Location of wound not shown.

He was mustered in as Capt. to date Aug. 22nd 1862, & vacated his commission Oct. 6th 1862, the date he accepted appointment as Capt. & adj. U.S.V.
