answer truly all interrogatories propounded to him during this special
examination of aforesaid claim for pension, deposes and says: I am
43 years old, occupation Hostler and my

I have known Benjamin Frisby and
his wife Henrietta Frisby near about
forty years. I got acquainted with
them at Church; they attended the same
Church I did. And I have known them
intimately ever since.

I got acquainted with them in this
City, and they told me that they came
from Queen Ann County, Md.
I don't know how long they had
lived in Baltimore before I became
acquainted with them.

I knew them before the War, but
cannot say how long before the War.
I know positively that they lived
together as husband and wife from
the first time I knew them con-
tinuously up to the time he was taken
to the hospital just before he died
except while he was in the army.

I don't know when they were
married. They were living together
as husband & wife when I first knew
them. Benjamin Frisby has been
dead about a year. He died in this
City and left about two hundred
