On this 4th day of January, 1902, at
Baltimore City, county of _____
 State of Maryland, before me, A. H. Davis, a
 special examiner of the Bureau of Pensions, personally appeared
William White, who, being by me first duly sworn to
 answer truly all interrogatories propounded to him during this special
 examination of aforesaid claim for pension, deposes and says: I am near
 60 years old though don't know exactly my age,
 occupation none, and my residence & P.O. address
 is No. 217 S. Parrish St., Baltimore, Md.

I have known Benjamin Frisby and his
 wife Henrietta ever since the year 1867.
 I was a private in Company A. of the
 1st Regt. U.S.C. Vol. Inf. and was discharged
 from that Co. in 1865, I think in the
 Spring and not long after President Lincoln
 was shot. It was about two years
 after my discharge and return to Balti-
 more that I got acquainted with Ben
 Frisby and I knew him and his wife
 continuously thereafter until his
 death. I have lived in the same
 neighborhood with them during all
 that time and seen them often and
 visited them in their home.

I know that Benjamin Frisby and
 his wife Henrietta lived together
 as husband and wife continuously
 from 1867 when I first became acquaint-
 ed with them to the day he died,
 and were never separated, or divorced.

Benjamin Frisby died here in this City
 about a year ago, I think, though I
 did not see his dead body or attend
 his funeral. Henrietta has not re-
