It is alleged that *John W. Smith* enlisted *Dec 18*, 18*63*

and served as *Private* in Co. *8*, *19th* Reg't *U.S. Col. Inf*

also as *Private* in Co. *4*, *10* Reg't *U.S. Col. Inf* in 1880

In Co. 8. Comd'd by Capt Davis

and was discharged at *Philadelphia Pa*, *Aug 19th*, 18*65*

It is also alleged that while on duty at *Benedict Md*

on or about *1863*, he was disabled by *Misery in Head*

and was treated in hospitals of which the names, locations, and dates of treatment are as follows: *At Kings Hill Hosp. Baltimore Md*

In case of the above-named soldier the War Department is requested to furnish an official statement of the enrollment, discharge, and record of service so far as the same may be applicable to the foregoing allegation, together with full medical history. Please give the rank he held at the time he is claimed to have incurred the disability alleged, and if records show that he was not in line of duty during that period, let the fact be stated.
