

under treatment and in charge of the
regimental Surgeon Dr. Morse
now dead.

While at Jacksonville Fla I was treated
by Dr the Hospital Steward, whose name
I cannot recall.

My regiment left Jacksonville, and went
to Dutch Gap Canal, or Bermuda Hun-
dred. I was with my regiment some-
times on duty, often with the Surgeons
sick, up to the surrender of Lee.

This from I think Fall of 1864, to April 1865.
My regiment went to Texas in June 1865
and remained there to Oct, 1866.

I was sick when we started for Texas and
was sick most all the time I was there.
While in Texas, I suffered with, Cough,
pains in my breast, mostly in left side,
near my heart. affection of testes.

Hemorrhage, Scoury, and Diarrhoea.
Was only treated in Camp Hospital in
Texas. Had Diarrhoea at Jack-
sonville Fla. In front of Petersburg
Va, and in Texas, and at Muste out.

Since Discharge, I lived in Accomac Co
Va 1866, 1867, 1868. Dr Dix now dead
treated me for rheumatism, Colds, and
Miserly in my side, and diarrhoea.

My old master & mistress paid my Drs
bill and gave me something to eat.
In 1869 for about 5 months I lived with
a Thomas Powell of Hancock, Accom-
Mac Co. Va. from 67. to 69, a colored woman
named Comfort. Bloxson, now living in
Hampd Co. Md nursed me, she
has since married a man named
Waters. After I left Mr Powell
I came to Baltimore City Md, and have
