 pension claim, deposes and says: I am 52 years of age

Know claimant slightly before he enlisted

Saw claimant soon after he came home from the army
 discharged, the war was then over.

I was then living with Capt Geo. Warner near Drummond
 town, Accomac Co, Va. Claimant came there, as his
 mother at that time was working for Mr Warner.

Claimant after discharge made his home on Mr
 Perry Moore's place for about one year. Then he went to
 work for Mr Thos Powell at Onancock, nearby.

I moved to Baltimore City a year, or two before claimant
 dis. and I think about two years after claimant came home
 from the army.

Remember that claimant during the spring following his
 return from the army, and while living on Mr Moore's
 place, was sick. Don't know the name of the disease
 he had, but know that he broke out all over with sores,
 it might have been the small pox, don't know, but do
 know that lots of people thenabouts had the same disease
 and that they afterwards burned their bedding.

I helped take care of him, but still did my work in the
 family when I was employed.

Know that when claimant got home from the army, and
 so long as I remained in Accomac Co, Va. he had a
 cough, and I heard Dr Dix say his lungs were affected.
 Know also that he was crippled in his legs specially his
 right leg, from discharge till I left Accomac
