Sir:

I have the honor to acknowledge the receipt from your Office of application for Pension No. 170921, and to return it herewith, with such information as is furnished by the files of this Office.

It appears from the Rolls on file in this Office, that Josiah Briscoe was enrolled on the 22nd day of October, 1863, at St. Mary's Ind in Co. "I", 7th Regiment of U S C Troops Volunteers, to serve three years or during the war, and mustered into service as a Private on the 5th day of November 1863, at Camp Stanton Charles Co Ind, in Co. "I", 7th Regiment of U S C Troops Volunteers, to serve three years, or during the war. On the Muster Rolls of Co. "I" of that Regiment, for the months of from organization to August 31st 1864, he is reported "Present for or on detached duty" September and October 1864 "Wounded in action and sent to Hosp. Oct. 28. 1864" "Present for duty" on all subsequent muster rolls of Co. He was mustered out with Co. at Indianola Texas October 13, 1866 - with remark "xx Absent wounded, from Oct 28. 64 to Nov 1/64 - in front of Richmond Va - wounded July 9/64 Johns Island S.C. xx" (Capt.)
