Personally came before me, a Clerk of the Superior Court in and for
 aforesaid County and State, John Young and Thomas Proctor
 citizens of the County of Baltimore, State of Maryland, reputable
 and entitled to credit, and who, being duly sworn, declare in relation to aforesaid claim, as follows:

That they
each for themselves, well know the applicant Jonah
Baisac, who was a member of Co. I, and that they have
perfect and personal knowledge, that he received
a gun shot wound carrying away part of the right
index finger - that it occurred while in action on the
right of Fort Harrison on or about the 29th day of September
1864, and was treated at the Hospital at Camp Batou for
one month, then he reported to the Regiment.

They also declare that on or about the 9th day of
July 1864, at Johns Island South Carolina they
have personal and perfect knowledge - Jonah
Baisac received a gun shot wound in the
head, and that he lay dead about 15 minutes
or supposed to be dead, and that he was sent
from the Regiment to a Hospital at Beaufort
where he remained one month, when he
returned to the Regiment.

Our means of knowing of the facts
are that I John Young was a member of Co. G 7th Regt
U. S. Col. Troop - and I Thomas Proctor was a
member of Co. I 7th Regt - and were personal friends
of Jonah Baisac.

We further declare that we have no interest in said claim, and are not concerned in its
 prosecution.
