

Baltimore Monday Jan'y 25th 1864

The Board met, read & approved Saturday's proceedings as herein recorded.

A letter enclosing one dollar for blanks, was received from Mr. R. W. Donovan, Denton, Md.; and the blanks sent as requested.

Mrs. Joanna Thomas, No 10. S. Bond St. Baltimore presented claim for slave John V. Warner, and has a certificate of enlistment, signed by J. W. Parrington, Capt Co A, 4th Reg^t U. S. C. Troops.

Mr. J. R. Water, Dorraid Co. claims for slaves, and was supplied with blanks.

Mr. Richd C. Filghman, Centerville Md., claims several enlisted slaves.

Capt. Lowndes of the U. S. Navy, claims a large number of slaves, and had the muster-rolls examined by his son.

Mr. Hugh Davy Evans of Baltimore, and many others were supplied with blanks.

The President addressed a letter to Maj. C. W. Foster, asst. Adj't. Genl. Vols. Washington, asking if citizens of Missouri, whose slaves have been recruited for the Regiments of Colored Troops raised in Maryland, are entitled to recognition before this Board, as Claimants?

A communication was received from Brig. Genl. Wm. Birney, requesting the President to send him three hundred blanks for claimants.

Mr. S. W. Gosnell, No. 7 Waverly Terrace, Baltimore, filed the application of Samuel Ward of Baltimore County, for remuneration for the service of Charles Grant, enlisted in the Fourth Regiment U. S. C. Troops.

Mrs. Joanna Thomas, No 10, S. Bond St. Baltimore, filed her application for compensation for John V. Warner, enlisted in the Fourth Regiment U. S. C. T., Co A.

Blanks were supplied to Judge Price of Balto. Co., Josiah Carroll of Hickelms, Dorchester County, and others.
