

Centre Ville Tuesday January 16th 1849
The Court met pursuant to adjournment

Ordered that the indentures of apprenticeship of Negro boys George and John Clarkson to Lem, Roberts be received, filed and recorded.

On application of filing renunciation, ordered that Letters of Administration on the estate of Charles Potts, late of Queen Anne's County dec^d, be granted and committed unto Nathaniel Newvill, who executes a bond in the penal sum of two thousand dollars, with James Hickey and Woolman & Gibson as his securities.

Ordered that a warrant be issued to William B. Legg and Michael Downes to appraise the personal property of Charles Potts, late of Queen Anne's County dec^d.

Ordered that the valuation of Real Estate of Mary E. and Laura Mason, minors & wards of John Parvill & wife be received, filed and recorded.

Ordered that the account of sales of the personal property of Thomas B. Cook, late of Queen Anne's County dec^d, be received, filed & recorded.

Ordered that the list of bonds specifically bequeathed by and due to Thomas B. Cook aforesaid be received, filed & recorded.

Ordered that the first administration account of Thomas B. Cook deceased, be received, filed & recorded.

On application of James Graham Executor of Charles Scully late of Queen Anne's County dec^d, the Court appoint James Merrick and Benjamin Wilson to divide the negroes belonging to said deceased's estate agreeably to his will.

Ordered that the letter of ^{John & Goldsmith} relation to his apprentice John & Goldsmith in which he requests to be released from the same be received & filed the apprentice & his mother being present & consenting thereto, the Court order & direct that the indentures of apprenticeship be & they are hereby declared to be null and void from & after this date.

On application the parties being in open court & by consent of minors mother who is also present, the Court have this day bound the said apprentice John & Goldsmith to John & Goldsmith, to learn the art and mystery of a Boot and shoe maker.

Ordered that the report of the sale of the real estate of James Bordley late of Queen Anne's County dec^d, made by Philemon B. Steffen, Executor of said deceased, be ratified and confirmed, unless cause to the contrary be shown on or before the first day of April next; provided a copy of this order be inserted in some news paper printed on the Eastern Shore of Maryland for three weeks, before the first day of March next.

The report states that the sale amounted to \$2740.00.

Ordered that the account of sales of the personal property of Maria E. Silghman, late of Queen Anne's County dec^d, be received, filed and recorded.

The Court adjourns till Tuesday next the 23rd Instant.
