Streeter Esquires, each of whose testimony having been committed to writing & signed, the Court denied the same to be filed and the case was postponed and Court adjourned till tomorrow being Tuesday the 29th Instant.

Whereas a paper purporting to be the last will and testament of Benjamin Ringgold has been filed in the office of Register of Wills for Queen Anne's County, in which said will, Augusta Ringgold, Ann Hobbs, Ellen Ringgold, Mary Ringgold being children of William Ringgold - Thomas Jacob Myer, Ann Louisa Myer, Sarah Myer, Eliza Jane Myer, Harriet Myer, Charles Myer, Children of Thomas Myer, Mary Jane Bradford, Maria R. Stump, wife of Sam^l Stump, Jane Ringgold Seas, and Maria Seas, are named as Legatees & Devisees, and whereas a caveat has been filed against admitting said will to probate by Carmichael & Brown Esqrs, attorneys for Wm. A. G. Hobbs

and wife, one of the legatees & devisees, it is ordered by the Court this 29th day of October 1850, that the Register of Wills, summon the said legatees & devisees (other than the said Hobbs & wife) to be & appear in said Court on Tuesday the 26th day of November next, to take such steps as to them shall seem fit in the premises.

On application & by direction of the Court heretofore given to the Register of Wills, to grant letters of Administration on the estate of Robert S. Welch late of Queen Anne's County, dec^d, to his Widow Sarah S. Welch, upon her executing a bond in the penal sum of fifteen hundred dollars with Joshua Wall, & John S. Elliott as her sureties, and the same having been done on the 15th Instant by said Register (while up the County) said bond being this day filed in his office, it is ordered by the Court that a warrant be issued to Arthur & Sudler and Christopher Good hand to appraise the personal property of said Robert S. Welch, deceased.

Ordered that the 1st Adm^t, account of Valentine Hewitt dec^d, be received, filed and recorded.

Ordered that the distribution of the personal estate of said Valentine Devorix dec^d, be received, filed & recorded.

Ordered that the Inventory of Personal property of John Die (Free Negro) deceased, be received, filed & recorded.

On application of Wm Chambers Adm^r of John Die, F.N. dec^d, ordered that he sell at public or private sale (or at private sale for not less than the appraised value) for cash or on a credit of six months at his discretion the whole of the personal property of said dec^d negro, except

Ordered that Wm Chambers Adm^r of John Die, F.N. dec^d, give the notice required by law to the Creditors of said dec^d, to present their respective claims by publication in one of the Centre Ville News papers.

The Court appoint, on application of Nathaniel Levidge Adm^r of Benajah Levidge, John R. Hamm & Wm McKinnis to divide the negroes belonging to said dec^d estate among his Representatives. The Court adjourned till Tuesday next 5th November 1850
