

Ordered that the account of sales of the personal property of John Die, deceased, be received, filed & recorded.

A petition in writing from John Dyott praying to be released from liability on account of his apprentice boy Isaac Knotts heretofore transferred to him by the widow of his former master Saml. H. Tucker, deceased, & that said apprentice be rebound to Nathaniel Keavitt, the parties being all present in open Court & said apprentice being present & consenting thereto, the Court grant the same and rebound the said Isaac Knotts accordingly.

Ordered that the Adm^r account of William Burrows dec^d, be received, filed and recorded.

Ordered that the indentures of apprenticeship of John Griffin, free negro boy to Jesse Reed, be rec^d, filed & recorded.

On application, (the renunciation of Samuel B. Meredith the joint executor being filed & recorded) Ordered that letters testamentary on the estate of Benjamin Meredith deceased be granted & committed unto William Meredith, the only remaining executor named, who executes a bond in the penal sum of six thousand dollars, with George Spry & Samuel B. Meredith of Queen Anne's County & Richard Moffatt of Kent County, securities.

Ordered that a Warrant be issued to Elijah E. Mafsey and Thomas J. Britton, to appraise the personal property of Benjamin Meredith, late of Queen Anne's County, dec^d.

Ordered that the 1st & 2^d Guardians Accounts of Ann E., Susan M., Sarah L. & Christopher B. Lynch, Wards of Sarah & Lynch be received, filed and recorded.

And in the matter of the paper writing alleged to be the last Will & testament of W. F. Legg, late of the State of Ohio deceased & continued from 13th Instant, the Court this day hear & have committed to writing the testimony of Clinton Cook Esquire, who as attorney for Jonathan Evans & Deborah his wife did this day file a caveat against said paper writing being admitted to probate, Ordered the said caveat be filed & the Case continued.

The Court adjourned till Tuesday next 26th Instant.

Hobbs and Henry Lowe, be and they are hereby appointed to divide the negroes belonging to the estate of Robert J. Brown, deceased amongst his representatives.
