Indenture made upon and twenty seventh day of February in the forty eighth Year
the right Honourable Cecilius absolute Lord and Proprietary of the Provinces of
above Lord Baron of Baltimore & over the said Province of Maryland An
Athousand sevare hundred sevendty and one Between Vincent Atchinson of the County of Saint
Marys in the said Province of Maryland Planter and Hannah his wife of the one Part and
William Coulbourne of the County of Dorset in the said Province of Maryland Gent of the
other Part Witneseth that whereas William Coulbourne late of this Province of Maryland Planter
ceased was in his life Time seized of an Estate in fee simple of divers and sundry Tracts
of Land and dividends of Land within this Province by Virtue of several Letters Patents
granted to him granted by the right Honourable Cecilius & under the great Seal of this Province
or and upon the Conditions of Plantations which are under divers and sundry Consideration
Conditions Restrictions Limitations and Provisions in the said several Letters Patents
mention'd Limited and Express'd as by the said Letters Patents remaining upon Rec-
ord in the Secretary's Office at date more fully appear And the said William Atchinson be-
ing thereof so Seized did afterwards to wch the 18th Day of December in the Six and
forty eighth Year of the Dominion of Cecilius & annoque Domini One thousand Six
hundred and Sixty Seven by his last Will and Testament in Writing under his hand
and Seal Give and Bequeath unto Mary Smith by the name of his loving wife Mary
his Estate for ever All his Lands Goods Chattels whatsoever By Virtue of which
twise the said Mary became therof seized of an Estate of inheritance in the said
Lands and therof dyed seized without making any Disposition there of in her Lifetime
whereby the said Lands are by the Death of the said Mary Descended to the said Hannah
wife to the said Vincent Atchinson as the sole Heir and Sister of the said Mary where-
by the said Hannah is become lawfully seized of an Estate of Inheritance in the same
Now this Indenture further Witneseth that the said Vincent Atchinson and Hannah
his wife for and in consideration of Ten Thousand Pounds of Tobacco and Ten Shillings
or Money Sterling to them in hand Paid by the said William Coulbourne the receipt
whereof they do hereby acknowledge and thereof and of every Part and Parcel thereof
clearly and absolutely acquit and discharge the said William Coulbourne his Heirs
executors Administrators and Assigns by these Presents Have given granted bargained
sold Infested and confirmed And by these Presents do give Grant Bargain Sell enforfe and
enforce unto him the said William Coulbourne his Heirs and Assigns all that tract
or Parcel or Dividend of Land called Broad Oak Situate lying and Being in the County of
Talbot in the said Province of Maryland on the North side of Choptank River on the West
side of a brook called Cullen Brook Beginning at a marked Oak standing
near the creek and running down the creek for breadth Two hundred and fifty Perches
to another marked Oak standing on the creek side bounding on the South by a line drawn
West North West from the said Oak for length Three hundred and Twenty Perches on the
West by a line drawn North from the End of the West North West Line Two hundred and
fifty Perches On the North by a line drawn East South East past the End of the South
line Three hundred and Twenty Perches unto the first marked Oak On the East by the first
South line containing by Estimation five Hundred Acres both more or less And also
a other Tract Parcel or Dividend of Land called Smith's Bluff Situate lying and Being in
the said County of Talbot in the said Province of Maryland in the Northern Branch of
Choptank River called by the Name of Tuckahoe Creek on the Western side of the Creek &
joining to the Land of Peter Sharp Beginning at a marked Beech tree being the Lowermost
corner Tree of the said Sharp's Land and running for breadth from the said Corner forth
toun the first six hundred and forty Perches to a marked Beech tree standing upon a point
an Indian Field bounded on the South by a line drawn West for Length
Beech five hundred Perches On the West by a line drawn North from the
