Among the Records of Talbot County and in a deed from Richard Woollers
 to Jacob Woollers and Phillip Woollers ^{dated 1st October 1718.} are the following preamble to wit —
 and also that the said Richard Woollers for his part of the said land shall
 begin where the said Phillip Woollers west line ends and running west
 two hundred and fifty perches then north one
 from thence East two hundred and fifty perches from
 the said Phillips line unto his first beginning containing
 fifty eight acres To have and to hold the said two hundred
 of land with all and every the appurtenances unto him the said
 Woollers his heirs and assigns to the only proper use and to
 the said Richard Woollers his heirs and assigns for ever ag.
 Jacob and Phillip woollers their heirs and assigns or
 person or persons by from or under them or either of
 Jacob Woollers for his part of the said land shall begin at the said white oak
 standing on a point near the mouth of the Mill Creek it being the most
 marked tree that his Brother Phillip began at and running west with the said
 Phillip and Richard Woollers land five hundred perches from thence south nine
 perches from thence south seventy seven Degrees East two hundred and ten perches
 perches from thence with a line draw East north East three hundred and seven
 perches unto ^{his} first beginning tree containing two hundred and fifty eight acres
 of land To have and to hold the said two hundred fifty eight acres of land and all
 and every the appurtenances unto him the said Jacob Woollers his heirs and assigns
 and unto the only proper use and behoofe of him the said Jacob Woollers his heirs
 and assigns for ever against them the said Richard Woollers his heirs and assigns
 and every of them also against us
 by from or under them or either of them in Witnes where
 said have to to these presents indented interchangeably s.
