Among the Records of Talbot County and in a Deed from Jacob Wood  
William Robins for a part of a tract of land called Smiths Clifts and also  
part of a tract of land called Home Hill Dated April 18<sup>th</sup> in the year  
one thousand seven hundred and thirty five are the following Descriptions as  
Have been granted bargained sold aliened Released in fee and confirmed  
by these presents as for themselves and their Heirs clearly and absolutely give  
Grant Bargain sell alien Release in fee and confirm unto the said  
Robins his Heirs and assigns forever as well all that part of a tract or part  
of land (which is now in the tenure and Occupation of the said Jacob  
Wood) called by the name name of Smiths Clifts lying in Talbot Co  
the northern main Branch of Choptank River called by the name  
: hoc Creek on the western side of the Creek containing two or  
one acres as also all that part of a tract or parcel of land (which  
also in the tenure and Occupation of the said Jacob Wood) &  
the name of Home Hill lying and being in Talbot County & on the  
side of Choptank River and on the west side of the western branch  
said River and contiguous to the aforesaid part of a tract or part  
land called Smiths Clifts containing thirty and four acres more or less
