In the name of God (Amen) I George Thompson of Talbot County and province of Maryland being sick and weak in body but of perfect mind & memory (thanks be to God for the same) do make this my last Will and Testament disannulling and revoking all former Wills by me made anywise And with that worldly Estate it hath please the almighty God to endow me with I do Dispose off in manner & form following (Viz) In primis I desire that my Water Mill with all its Utensils together with six Acres of Land laid out by the direction of Friends John Dickinson so as to include all the houses about the mill be sold also a Negro boy named Barculus & my stile in order to pay off my just Debts. Item I desire that my Dwelling Plantation be Equally divided between my two sons William & George Thompson. And my further will is that after all my just debts are paid and my wife hath taken her third that the residue of my personal Estate be Equally divided between my four children viz. William, George, Sarah & Ann Thompson And of this my last Will and Testament I do constitute and appoint my loving wife Elizabeth Thompson whole & sole Executrix. In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand & seal this twenty third day of February 1767 George Thompson Seal

Signed sealed & declared by the aforesaid George Thompson to be his last Will & Testament in presence of John Dickinson, Robert ^{his} Jarwin, Charles C. ^{his} Lloyd. Talbot County Set

The 19th May 1767 Elizabeth Thompson Executrix of the above Testator George Thompson maketh Oath on the Holy Evangelists of almighty God that the above Instrument of writing is the true (and only) Will and Testament of the said George Thompson that hath come to her hands possession or Knowledge and that she doth not know or hath ever heard of any other.
