Deed dated the eleventh day of
October 1784. For the consider-
ation of the sum of Fifteen hundred
and thirty eight pounds ten shillings
current money of Maryland,

the said Griffin Fauntleroy & John Fauntleroy conveys to the
said John Hardecastle all that part of a Tract of Land called and
known by the name of Chesnut Bay which the said John Fauntleroy
had heretofore purchased of a certain John Jenkinson and according
to the metes and bounds of said Deed, and also all that part
of a Tract of Land called and known by the name of Smiths
Cliffs, which lays on the north side of the deep Branch
and the Mill Branch and also all that part of a Tract
of Land called Dudleys Cliffs, containing ^{thirty} three acres and
one half acre of Land; and also all that part of a Tract
of Land called Masio Green, containing Two acres and one
half acre of Land; and also all that part of a Tract of
Land called Horse point, containing in the whole six
hundred and fifteen acres of Land more or less situated
lying and being in Talbot County afo. and on the west
side of Tuckahoe Creek.
