My Thomas Ozmont.

Sir

You'll please to inform Col. Lloyd, that from his Boundary on Horsepoint (which is admitted by M^r. John Hardcastle) and as the line directs to Arthur Clarke at the Mill, but on Horsepoint M^r. J^r. Hardcastle has (in my opinion) taken at least Fifteen hundred of the Col^l's rails, without my knowledge at the time, otherwise I should have Endeavoured to stop him from taking them off. I lodge this information with you, as conceiving it strictly my duty. And you'll also inform Col. Lloyd that these rails has been taken away lately, and long since M^r. Hardcastle gave up in my presence, all pretensions to Horsepoint, and setting forth at the same time, that Horsepoint was the property of Col. Lloyd —
