Letter to

Honorable Sir

I have agreeable to your request, been
 with Mr. Freeman (the Overseer of Mr. Henry Nicols) since
 you was up, and convers'd with him again respecting those
 Lands of yours, he informs me a second time, that three
 years ago this Spring, when he was about to Newrun the Fence
 as shewn you when you were up, that Mr. Nicols was
 present, and that he told Mr. Nicols, he was inform'd, that
 when you came to have your Land run Out, your line
 would go inside of the Corner of the Peach Orchard, and that
 he thought it best to set the Fence where there would be
 no danger of losing it, Mr. Nicols replied and directed
 him to set the Fence where it was most convenient, and that
 he should run all risques, and the presumption was, the
 fence was taken down and put up at or Near the same place.

Mr. Freeman knows nothing of this line
 as to his own certain knowledge, but that he had the above
 information from Mr. John Hardecastle the Elder. I also
 Convers'd with Mr. Freeman respecting the limits of my
 cutting, as shewn you, he tells me that he doth not ^{know} that it
 is admitted by Mr. Nicols, but that your former Tenants had
 cut out that far, without any Interruption, and that he
 consents
