

No 56 1794, Jan. 27 Warrant for Resurvey of 'Holm Hill' and part of Smiths Cliffs, Talbot County

THE STATE OF MARYLAND, ff.

WHEREAS *Edward Lloyd Esq.* of *Talbot* county, did set forth, that there was escheat to the state *part of a Tract or parcel of Land Called Holm Hill Originally on the Bay of Anno Domini* Granted unto *for acres* also part of a Tract of Land Called *Smiths Cliffs Originally on the Bay of Anno Domini* Granted unto *for acres* both lying and being in Talbot County

which *parts of Tracts of Land* afterwards became the property of *Sarah Morgan* who died seized thereof, intestate and without heirs, by which means the same had become escheat, and *he* being the first discoverer, and desirous to purchase the same, be it escheat by the means aforesaid, or by any other ways or means whatsoever, required a special warrant to effect and secure it with any contiguous vacancy; and that on a return of

certificate of such resurvey, *he* paying for the said escheat, and for the vacancy added, and complying with all other requisites, agreeable to act of Assembly, may obtain a grant of confirmation thereon, which escheat and vacancy are to be paid for within one year from the date hereof. Lay out, therefore, and carefully resurvey for and in the name of the said *Edward Lloyd* the aforesaid *parts of Tracts* of land, according to *the* ancient metes and bounds; NEVERTHELESS correcting and amending any errors in the original survey, and by your outlines adding any vacant land thereto contiguous, not running your

lines within the lines of any former or more ancient survey, nor lands reserved by act of Assembly; and return your certificate of such resurvey with the name of the land, the exact quantity therein contained, and a distinguishable account of the number of acres of vacant land added, with the improvements on the whole, and the value of such escheat land and improvements, on oath, into the land office for the Western Shore within one year from the date hereof, thence to be transmitted to the Examiner General for due examination, in order that patent may issue thereon; and for your so doing, this shall be your sufficient warrant and authority. Given under the seal of office this *twenty seventh* day of *January* Anno Domini *seventeen*
