

The State of Maryland Jan^y 6th of July 1795

By virtue of a Special Warrant of Escheat Granted out of the
Land office unto Edward Lloyd Esq^r of Talbot County bearing date
the 38th day of October 1794 to Resurvey the following Tract or part
of a Tract or part of a Tract and to reduce the same into one Tract
(Viz) a Tract, Part of a Tract of Land called Holmehill originally
on the day of Granted unto John Holmwood for acres
Also part of a Tract of Land called Smiths Cliffs originally on the
day of Granted unto for acres

Both lying and being in the County afo^r which Tract or part of a Tract
and part of a Tract afterwards became the property of Sarah Morgan who
did die of Intestate and without heirs by which means the same
had become Escheat to the State of Maryland afo^r as may appear &c

I Humbly Certify that I have by Virtue of the afo^r Warrant carefully Resurveyed
for and in the name of him the afo^r Edward Lloyd Esq^r the afo^r parts of Tracts of Land
according to their ancient metes and bounds and find them to contain as follows
Part of Holmehill I find to contain sixty two acres - Also Part of Smiths Cliffs
I find to contain one hundred thirty three and a half acres two and a Quarter acres of
which I find to be included within the Lines of John Indcastles Mill Land which
I have excluded - Also forty nine acres of which I find to be included within the
Lines of another ~~part~~ of part of the said Tract of Land called Smiths Cliffs
which I have excluded so that there remains of the s^d part of Smiths Cliffs
Only the quantity of one hundred forty two and one Quarter acres clear of other surveys
And have by Virtue of the afo^r Warrant Reduced the whole into one Entire Tract now
called Lloyd's Escheat lying and being in Talbot County afo^r and on the west side
of Tuckahoe Creek Beginning for the out Lines of the Resurvey at an old
dead white oak which lays on the ground it formerly being the Division tree between
Jacob and Philip Hooters then runs North three Degrees thirty Minutes East one
Hundred and Twenty four perches to an old white oak stump on a Point called
Horse Point then west one hundred and fifty Eight perches till it intersects the
Mill Land then with the Lines of the s^d Mill Land south Twenty degrees west
fifteen and one half perches North Seventy three degrees forty five minutes
West ten perches to a white oak it being the first Boundary of the said Mill
Land then runs along the Mill Pond bounded therewith according to the usual
meanders thereof South thirty seven degrees forty five minutes west Eight perches
then North sixty Eight degrees West Eleven and one Quarter perches till it intersects
