The State of Maryland 1st January 25th 1806 -

By virtue of a Special warrant of Excheat Granted out of the Land office unto Aaron Anthony of Tallbot County bearing date the twenty third day of April Eighteen Hundred and five to Resurvey the following Tract or part of Tracts of Land and to reduce the same in to one Tract (viz) a part of a Tract of Land called Holme Hill originally on the day of

Granted unto John Holme wood for five thousand acres Also part of a Tract of Land called Smiths Clifts originally on the third Day of March 1660 Granted unto William Smith for two thousand acres Both lying and being in the County of which Tract or part of Tracts of Land afterward became the property of Sarah Morgan who died seized thereof Intestate and without Heirs by which means the same had become Excheat to the State of Maryland As May appear &c I Herely certify that I have by virtue of the aforesaid warrant Carefully Resurveyed for and in the name of him the said Aaron Anthony the said parts of Tracts of Land according to their Antient metes and bounds and find them to contain as follows the part of Holme Hill I find to contain one half acre the part of Smiths Clifts I find to contain forty acres and one half acres and I have by virtue of the said warrant Reduced the whole in to one Intere Tract now called Kentucky Lying Lying and being in Tallbot County Asst and on the West Side of Tuckahoe Creek Beginning for the out Lines of the Resurvey at an old post put down in the place where the original white oak stood where the settlers begun for their Division in the above named original Lands and from thence runs unto and ending in the water of Tuckahoe Creek the five following Courses to wit North Sixty Six degrees and forty five minut East fourteen perches North Eighty Seven degrees East twenty Eight perches South twenty five degrees East Six perches North fifty five degrees East fourteen perches North Six perches thence running by and with the Marsh of a small Creek called Mill Creek the fifteen following Courses North fourteen degrees and thirty minute East twenty perches South Eighty one degrees East Seven perches North forty two degrees East ten perches South Eighty nine degrees East Eight perches North Eight perches North fifty degrees West ten perches North fifteen degrees East twelve perches North twenty degrees West Six and one half perches South Eighty five degrees West four perches South twenty five degrees East Eight perches South fifty five degrees West ten perches North Eighty one degrees West ten perches South fifty nine degrees and thirty minute West nine
