State of Maryland ss, } By Virtue of a Special Warrant of
February 13th, 1826. } Escheat, granted out of the Land office
for the Eastern Shore, unto Aaron Anthony
Esq. of Talbot County bearing date the eighth
day of March Eighteen hundred and twenty
five, to resurvey part of a tract of land called
Smiths Cliffs & originally on the fourth of July
1665, granted unto William Smith for 2000^{ac}
beginning the corner
of land afterwards became the property of a
certain Colburn, who died seized thereof
intestate without heirs, by which means the same
became escheat to the State of Maryland
as may appear &c.

I Herby Certify that I have by virtue of the aforesaid warrant carefully
resurveyed and laid down for and in the name of him the said
Aaron Anthony Esq. the aforesaid part of a tract of land called
Smiths Cliffs (and find it to contain one acre and twelve and
one half perches of land more or less) Beginning at a stone marked
No. 1. Set down by Commissioners when the original White Oak stand
mentioned in a deed of division between Richard Sande & Philip
Wooters, dated the first day of October seventeen hundred and
eighteen as the beginning thereof, it being in the bank of Tuckahoe
Creek, and run from thence S 70^o W 13^{pc} to the corner
or East line of a tract of land called Halsey Hill, thence with that
line with an allowance of five degrees for variation S 27^o 30^{pc}
E. 20^{pc} to the water of Tuckahoe Creek, near the high land at
Southernmost side of a branch called "the Dry Gut" and from
the up Tuckahoe Creek and binding thence with N 20^o E. 23^{pc}
with a straight line to the first beginning containing and
being out for one acre and twelve ^{and one half} perches of land more or less.
