Talbot County, to wit: The State of Maryland, to James Chambers, Isaac Lee, Eusebio Leonard, Joseph Turner and William Blaghten of Talbot County, Gentlemen, Greeting: Whereas at a County Court of the said State, holden for Talbot County, at Easton, in said County, on the second Monday of November in the year of our Lord Eighteen hundred and twenty seven, Andrew Anthony of Talbot County, preferred his Petition to the Judges of the said County Court, setting forth, that a certain Aaron Anthony the father of the said petitioner departed this life on or about the day of in the year of our Lord Eighteen hundred and seized in his demise as of fee, of sundry Lands and Tenements, situate lying and being in Talbot County aforesaid. That the said Aaron Anthony died intestate, leaving the following named persons at the time of his death his lawful heirs and representatives, to wit, the petitioner the said Andrew Anthony and Richard Anthony both of whom are of lawful age and Lucretia P. Auld the wife of Captain Thomas Auld all of Talbot County aforesaid. That since the death of the said Aaron Anthony, the said Lucretia P. Auld hath departed this life leaving a daughter Ariana Amanda Auld, her only child an infant. That the lands and real estate whereof the said Aaron Anthony died seized as aforesaid, are now liable to be divided into three equal parts, but that the same cannot now be done, without the aid of this Court, by reason of the death of the said Lucretia P. Auld and the minority of her daughter the said Ariana Amanda Auld. And praying the said Judges to appoint a Guardian for and on behalf of the said Ariana Amanda Auld to act for her until this Commission shall be completed. And praying the said Judges to direct a Commission to issue to effect a division of the lands and real estate, whereof the said Aaron Anthony died seized as aforesaid among all the parties entitled, and so forth, according to the directions
