

Smiths Cliffs lying in Talbot County patented to William Smith 2000 Acres March 3. 1661.
William Smith died and Willed the said Land to Mary his Wife the 18th December 1667.
Mary the Wife of William Smith died without Will and the said Land Descended to
Hannah her Sister and Sole Heir.

Hannah the Sister of Mary Smith intermarried with a certain Vincent Atchinson of
Saint Marys County.

Vincent Atchinson and Hannah his Wife sold and conveyed Smiths Cliffs 2000 Acres
to a certain William Colebourne of Somerset County the 27th of February 1671.

William Colebourne sold and conveyed 560 Acres Part of Smiths Cliffs to Hall
the 25th Day of February 1680.

Wm. Colebourne sold and conveyed 400 Acres Part of Smiths Cliffs to John Wooters
the 25th Day of February 1680 as Per Deed Ent. in Liber B. folio 23. in Talbot

Co. It does not appear that Colebourne sold any more Land to Wooters than the
400 Acres as Expressed in the Preceding Entry.

John Wooters left to Sons and Willed his Land among them to wit
John - Jacob - Richard - and Phillip - but in what Manner the Will will shew

Phillip Wooters one of the Sons of John Wooters sold and Conveyed 238 Acres Part
of Smiths Cliffs to John Corney the 7th Day of October 1718 as Per Deed Ent. in the
Records of Talbot County in Liber RF No. D folio 398 397. The lines are as

follow with to wit. Beginning at a Marked white Oak standing on a Point near
the Mouth of a small Creek commonly known by the Name of the Mill Creek. It being
from thence to wit -

from thence with a line drawn East 250 Perches - And from thence with a running
South 165 Perches unto the first Beginning Tree containing 258 Acres. But
whereas there is Erected on the said Land a Water Mill And there hath been

formerly Granted for the Use of the said Mill 20 Acres of the said Land - The
said 20 Acres of Land is hereby Excepted and not Transferred Then the remain-
ing Part is 238 Acres -

John Corney sold and conveyed the aforesaid 238 Acres Part of Smiths Cliffs contain-
ed within the same lines, beginning at the same Marked White Oak and making the
same reserve of the 20 Acres of Mill Land as are above Expressed the 24th Day of

March 1719. as Per Deed Ent. in the same Liber RF No. D folio 398. Also the
said John Corney sold and conveyed 62 Acres Part of Holme Hill & included the

same in the same Deed with the 238 Acres Part of Smiths Cliffs to the same
Sarah Morgan on the same Day and Year and included within the following.

Beginning at the above mentioned White Oak and running
from thence with the above said Land West 248 Perches And from thence with
a line drawn South South East 86 Perches And from thence with a straight
line unto the Beginning Tree containing 62 Acres -

One of the Sons of the said Sarah Morgan Mortgaged the said 238 Acres Part of
Smiths Cliffs to Richard Bennett Esquire. But such Mortgage appears on the
Records of Talbot
