 pleasant knocked off early in the evening
 went to bed
 Sunday ^{9th}
 9th Rose late Perry very sick went over to
 see him found him better went to King
 creek church then to Dick's came home
 about night went to bed
 Monday ^{10th}
 10th Went over to Mr. Carter. Mr. Carter Mr. Martin
 Mr. Ridgeway & myself went a gunning
 kill a fox and a plenty of game extra
 got home in the night the wind
 blowing a gale north west went to
 bed

Tuesday ^{11th}
 11th Rose with the sun got ready &
 went to Easton met Mr. Martin nothing
 done had to come home miserable
 travelling with North west boys trimming
 the thicket fence got home about night
 after prayers went to bed
 Wednesday ^{12th}
 12th Rose a little before day very cool in the
 morning sun shining & clear sky sent Perry
 down to G. D. Martin in the cart with
 Perry & there was Mule in the shafts & I
 in the lead after some turnips putting & c
 Stephen cutting & mauling rails myself
 went a gunning in the morning my dog Jack
 performed very well not much game went
 out in the woods after dinner and mauling
 rails little breeze going about north east after
 supper went down to the mill talked with
 Aunt Abby never got home till after prayers
 about 1/2 past nine went to bed not feeling very
 well took 1/4 of Doct George Martin's pills
 Thursday ^{13th}
 13th Rose before day felt very unwell eat no
 breakfast went to bed again sent Stephen
 down to the mill to lend Mr. Smith a
 hand about digging a new race for the
 new mill felt better about 12 o'clock
 got up dressed myself and eat dinner
 then walked down to the mill found
 Dick there took our guns and went a
 gunning till a 2 partridges stopped at
 Mr. Smith's took supper came home Perry
 had come brought 5 or ten bushels of turnips
 Turkey hens 19 other & pullets from G. D. Martin
 sat supper after prayers went to bed having
 asked Mr. Smith to lend me his carriage could
 not do it without his wife's permission I would not
 ask her so I post paid going to Easton the
 next day Perry also brought 268 weight of Bacon
 6 lb of deer twine 1 box of blacking and brush
 1 cake of shaving soap and rope for the sun
 from G. D. Martin
