Personally appeared, Abraham Dupont, who being duly sworn says, That at the time of the breaking out of the present Indian disturbances, he, with his family, resided at Matanzas, about twenty miles south of St. Augustine, in the county of St. Johns, and that he continued residing there until the tenth day of May last past; That at that time he was driven off by a party of Indians - Mr. Joseph Long, who was with him, was killed; and he was obliged to seek protection in St. Augustine, and has not been able to return to his Plantation since, and by reason thereof he is deprived ordinary means of subsistence; and having no means, he is unable to support himself by his labor.

And he further says, That his family consists of himself as follows: to wit: Abraham Dupont, 53 years of age; Amanda, aged 18 years, Elizabeth, aged 13 years, Maria, aged 12 years, Cornelius, aged 12 years, and Benjamin, aged 10 years.
