The speculators are anxiously awaiting the arrival of the Britannia, who is in her eleventh day, and will be in in the course of tomorrow or next day. Flour has declined - it is varying from \$5.75 to \$6.12 - according to Brands. 2000 Bushels Genesee Wheat sold yesterday at \$1.30 - Corn is about 63¢.
