

Elliston 26th July 1847.

Dear Emory

I received yours of the 22nd yesterday but cannot now tell what the probability is of John's accepting the offer you speak of. At one time he was ready to go as private in Walker's company; but whether he would go now or not - I can't say. I have just written to him and enclosed your letter. He is at Father's at this time doing nothing, and he may possibly go with you. It is utterly impossible to say how many men he could get here and in Harford, and no one can tell till the effort is made.

John will write to you as soon as he receives this letter, and perhaps it would be as well to see him. You will find him at Father's and they will all be glad to see you there.
