

Clara Field May 24th 1853

My Dear Sir

Having determined to make a moderate charge hereafter for the use of my landing, and seeing your Cart pass by this morning with bark, I think it proper to inform you of the fact.

My reasons for doing so are the inconveniences I sustain And the damages which accrue from the continual passing and repassing of my door, gates left open, roads cut up, and occasionally the entire occupancy of my landing, by wood lime &c.

I have been receiving from the Capt. of vessels for some time a half cent per bushel for grain delivered, and I am sure you will agree with me that it is but fair that I should be compensated for the wood lime &c.

When we meet we can determine on what will be fair I have no doubt, if we cannot, whatever our friends or neighbours, think right I will agree to abide by.
