

Deed Registered to J. R. Emory conveying 126  
Acres of Land called Brampton - The lines as follow.  
No lines given in that Deed.

A Certificate to resurvey Conquest: Sheweth that Con-  
quest contains 394 acres - The lines as follow:

Begin at a marked red oak marked with twelve notches  
there on every side standing in the S<sup>o</sup> & by E line of a parcel  
of Land formerly laid out for Henry Coursey called  
Courseys point and running with said Land S<sup>o</sup> & by E  
400 p<sup>ts</sup> to a marked cedar tree by a small creek side then  
running N. E. 170 p<sup>ts</sup> to a marked rock Hickory by the af.  
Creek side thence N. W. with a parcel of Land called Bramp-  
ton 250 p<sup>ts</sup> thence N. W. by S<sup>o</sup> southerly 202 to the first bound-  
ed oak by the river side = Containing 394 Acres.

Deed Mrs. Kopper to J. R. Emory of 256 acres of Land after  
the 130 acres were Registered being the residue - Lines  
as follow: Begin at the cedar tree at the mouth of the Cove running  
thence N. E. 170 p<sup>ts</sup> to a tract of Land called Brampton and from  
thence with N. W. to Chester River, and from thence down with  
the said River and bounding thence with to the end of the  
North 40<sup>o</sup> W line of part of the same Land formerly sold  
to J. R. Emory, and from thence with line reversed  
S 40<sup>o</sup> E 92 p<sup>ts</sup> S 40<sup>o</sup> E 122 p<sup>ts</sup> thence S. W. by S. 50 p<sup>ts</sup> until  
it intersects the 1<sup>st</sup> S<sup>o</sup> & by E line of the original survey  
and from thence with a straight line to the Beg. of cedar
