Creek: Beginning at a Cedar post standing in a plant. ~~where~~

Post now dwells ~~at the path that leads to y<sup>e</sup> said~~ <sup>and running</sup>  
from said post South West by West twenty eight ft, then North  
West one hundred & fifty ft, then East North East one hundred  
twenty seven ft, then South South East one hundred eighty  
ft, then South Six deg<sup>s</sup> thirty Minutes & after by S<sup>outh</sup>
