

Collins Range. Laid out for Thomas Collins a Tract  
of Land on the South Side of Chester River on the Eastern  
side of Herring Branch Beginning at a marked white Oak  
standing by Sassafrake Road near the Run and running  
up the said Run Southerly three hundred & twenty perches  
to another marked Oak thence East One hundred & fifty  
perches thence North three hundred & twenty perches thence  
to the first Tree containing 300 Acres

Dungarnon Aug. 12<sup>th</sup> 1687 Laid out for Klotenis Selavant  
a parcel of Land lying on a Branch of Chester River called  
the red Lyon Branch, beginning at a marked Poplar at the  
End of the W<sup>c</sup> Line of Winchester and runs thence North 80  
p<sup>s</sup> and from the End of the North Line runs East 100 p<sup>s</sup> and  
from the End of the East Line runs SE. 293 p<sup>s</sup> then SW 150 p<sup>s</sup>  
where it intersects the Line of Thomas Collins Land then  
NW by Collins's Land 293 p<sup>s</sup> then W to the Beginning on  
the SW bounded by Collins's Land containing 300 Acres

Sheepards Redoubt April 6<sup>th</sup> 1707 Laid out for Francis Shep-  
ard a parcel of Land lying upon a Branch of Chester River  
called red Lyon Branch adjoining to the Land of Thomas  
Collins and the Land of Edward Elliot called Slaughterton be-  
ginning at a marked red Oak and runs thence 160 p<sup>s</sup> East to  
a marked Hickory thence W 50 p<sup>s</sup> to a marked white Oak thence  
ESE 100 p<sup>s</sup> to another marked white Oak thence SW 200 p<sup>s</sup> to  
a marked red Oak thence W 200 p<sup>s</sup> to another marked red Oak  
then N 100 p<sup>s</sup> to a marked red Oak in the Line of Slaughterton  
thence WNW by the Line of Slaughterton 70 p<sup>s</sup> to a marked  
spanish Oak thence on a direct Line to the Beginning bound-  
ed by these Lines containing 300 Acres
