

called the Misfortune beginning at the Point of Land at the mouth of St. Thomas's Branch at the letter A on the Plat and running thence up Bohemia Back Creek in a straight direction (rejecting the Meanders of the Creek) 750 Perches to the letter V, then according to the double red and green lines N E 320 p. to the letter V and from thence straight to the place of Beginning, containing Four Hundred Acres more or less.

Also I have by direction of the Defendant in the presence of the Sheriff Resurveyed and laid down for Illustration said Tract of Land called the Misfortune a second way beginning as before at the point of Land on the North Side of Bohemia Back Creek and on the East Side of the mouth of St. Thomas's Branch at the letter A on the Plat and running thence up Bohemia Back Creek 48 perches to the Letter W in the plat at a large point of Land called Francind's Point, then according to the double black and red lines N E 320 p. to the letter X, and from thence by a straight line to the place of beginning, containing Four Hundred and Sixty Four Acres more or less.

Also I have by direction of the Defendant in the presence of the Sheriff Surveyed and laid down the places mentioned in the Depositions of Jeremiah Taylor and Benjamin Bravard described on the Plat by the letters **Q Q Q Q** as having been enclosed and cultivated by the Defendant, also the House at the letter P and the Land enclosed in red drawn and crossed lines, as mentioned in the deposition of Noble Biddle as having been enclosed and cultivated by the Defendant for upwards of Twenty Years past. On the Ejectment Bouldon agt Biddle.

The Plaintiff lays down his Claim and Pretences in the very same manner as on the Ejectment agt Richardson and for the description of the Lands, Evidences &c. &c. Reference to be had to the said Plaintiff's Claim and Pretences on the said Ejectment, Bouldin agt Richardson.

On the said Ejectment Bouldin agt Biddle the Defendant lays down the Tracts of Land called Triangle, Francis-Mark, Richard's Chance, Bristole as resurveyed in 1744 Bouldin's Friendship and Warwick in the very same manner and with the same Evidences and Allegations of Boundaries, as on the Ejectment Bouldin agt Richardson, and for the Courses Distances, and Descriptions of the said Tracts of Land, Reference thereunto to be had.
