

This Indenture made this thirtieth . . . day of May . . .  
in the year Eighteen hundred and Twenty, between James T. Hensley of  
Queen Anne's County and State of Maryland of the one part, and Christopher  
Cox of the County and State of the other part. Witnesses, that the  
said James T. Hensley, for and in consideration of the sum of Six Thousand  
Two hundred and Twenty nine dollars and eighty seven and one half cents, current  
money to him in hand paid before the sealing and delivery of these presents  
the receipt whereof the said James T. Hensley doth hereby acknowledge,  
and from every part and parcel thereof doth hereby acquit, the said Christopher  
Cox his Heirs, Executors and Administrators. - In the said James T. Hensley  
hath granted bargained and sold, aliened infeoffed and confirmed, and by  
these presents doth grant bargain and sell, alien, infeoff, and confirm,  
unto the said Christopher Cox his Heirs and Assigns all those Tracts or  
parts of Tracts of Land called and known by the names of Carpenters  
Square, Greens Adventure upon Carpenters Square, Loyds Meadows, Truston  
Wells, Hensleys Reserve, Spongs Chance, Glover Fields and Youngs ~~land~~,  
Fortune, Beginning at a Stone set in the ground marked with the letter  
C. at the end of the third line of division between said James T. Hensley  
and Thomas Hensley's Land, and running thence with the fourth line of  
said division South eighty eight degrees and thirty minutes West one  
hundred and forty six perches to a stone set in the ground marked with  
the letter O, and running thence North twenty four degrees and fifteen  
minutes West sixty two perches to a Stone set in the ground marked  
with the letter X. and running thence North fifty one degrees and thirty  
minutes West thirty one perches and four tenths of a perch to a Stone  
set in the ground marked with the letter F, and running thence North  
nineteen degrees East twenty eight perches to the out bounds of  
Carpenters Square and thence with said land reversed North forty  
one degrees and thirty minutes East one hundred and forty six
