Note. Since the within survey was made, I have surveyed for Col. John A. Emory, two Lots purchased of Matthias George Lopp. to be added thereto, designated by red lines on the Plot, as Lots Nos. 1. and 2. No. 1. Begins at the end of fourteen perches and seven tenths of a perch on the 5th line and runs with said line South forty eight degrees thirty minutes East, one hundred and fifty nine perches and three tenths of a perch to the end thereof, thence South eighty degrees East one hundred and three perches and three tenths of a perch to the Public Road and thence North sixty one degrees West two hundred and fifty three perches and two tenths of a perch to the Beginning, containing twenty six acres, three rods and nineteen perches of Land.

No. 2, is a Woodlot and begins at a stone at the end of the 10th line and runs thence South 80^o East 63 7/20 pns, thence South 45^o West - 35 pns. thence South 24^o East 5 4/10 pns, thence South 65^o West 7 1/4 pns, thence North 80^o West 65 3/4 pns and thence North 43^o 30' East 44 1/2 pns to the beginning containing 14a, 3r. 17 pns of land. The Red Line from E. to X. represents an exchange of land to straighten fences, which is to be effected, simply by a change in the location of the fence, without any conveyance by either party.
