Sir.

Your two several letters

of June and January last have
been respectively received. About the
time that your letter of June enclosing
me a Power of Attorney to sell Harriok
and her children, reached me, Mrs
Griffith, who had been desirous of
becoming the purchaser, died.

By that event, the contemplated sale
could not take place. Her father
who has succeeded to the control of
her temporal interest, has expressed
his willingness to become himself the
purchaser, and on yesterday your friend
Mr Turpin, at my instance had a
view of Harriok and her children
