

Centre Ville Sept 24. 1830

Dear Sir

I thank you sincerely for the 2000⁰⁰ in
your note of this day, it is very acceptable, for
it appears to me that I am always to be needed.
I also thank you for your promise of further aid.
I found the paper ordered - We have nothing new, in
the political way, except that our accounts continue
to be favourable from the different parts of the
State - You have but one week more to move
in, and I do not think you have yet paid a visit
to the wild cat, which I think you ought to do,
I have no doubt of your being industrious, and
I think I accidentally had some evidence of it today.
Murphy called on me this morning to go to the
steam boat wharf with him, on our return we
saw a horse, hitched to a small house, near the
first gate, as you go into Brown's Farm, Murphy
said the horse was Mr. Telford's, and we both
concluded you were working business pretty well
in which we heartily wished you success -
