

Centerville 30<sup>th</sup> Apr 1835 —

My Dear Sir.

The judge has just given<sup>me</sup> a hundred dollars, and as I do not like to keep so much money about me I must beg you to accept it on our board-account. This will settle matters with us from the 1<sup>st</sup> of Nov. 1834. to 4<sup>th</sup> Apr 1835. — I must here insist upon your making out for me a separate account for wood. This will include of course both the present & the past winter. When we left Mrs Goulds we had about a months supply, but after that time were entirely indebted to you. —

I am going for a few days to see my poor beloved relations in Cambridge, and shall not be able to return before some time next week. — There will be no service of course here next Sunday afternoon. But at Wye there will I hope, as the Rev Mr Bayne has promised to supply my place.
