

Phila Sept 29 1835

John Filghman Esq

Dear Sir

Your favor of the 24<sup>th</sup> in re-  
-lation to the note of Kennedy & Filghman for \$700  
due first of November, would have been replied  
to at the time of its reception, had I not made  
an arrangement with my friend Lloyd at the  
same time to hold the note in my possession  
till it became due, unless the distribution  
took place sooner, & Lloyd said he would write  
the parties to this effect, which he thought would be  
all that was necessary - You may rest assured as  
well as the parties to the note, that it will re-  
-main with me till it is due, if they will pro-  
-vide for its payment at maturity in Phila  
instead of Hazerstown where it is dated & must be  
sent through Bank for collection - The request I made  
for Lloyd to have your liability continued for the  
Aunt I loaned him to lift the note for 1000 dollars on which  
you was Endorser, was made more on ac of the other  
parties interested & who were absent, than for myself  
I hope you will not think it unreasonable under these  
circumstances
