1836

Dear Uncle -

Your kind letter was received last evening, and I hasten at once to reply. The arrangement which Mr. Gilman demands, is different from what we would wish to make, could money be had elsewhere. But Father has made every exertion to get money from below, unsuccessfully - and as it is absolutely necessary for me to have funds, we will accept of Mr. T's offer - although an extension of time would be very desirable. The amount of \$1200 was predicated upon the idea, that it would have been agreeable to you, at once to take our share of Sherwood.

I shall appropriate a part of the money loaned by Mr. T. to take up, immediately, the note of H. & I. - and have a note of \$350 due 11th of Aug. in the Williamsport Bank. You will perceive that we have but a small amount left. If Mr. T. could let us have \$1500 we should prefer it.

We will at any moment put Sherwood into your hands, at your own
