In the name of God, Amen, I Frisley Gilghman of Washington County, in the State of Maryland being in perfect health of body, and of sound and disposing mind memory and understanding, considering the certainty of death, and the uncertainty of time thereof and being desirous to settle my worldly affairs, and thereby be the better prepared to leave this world, when it shall please God to call me hence, do therefore make and publish this my last Will and Testament in manner and form following, that is to say,

First and principally I commit my soul into the hands of Almighty God, and my body to the earth, and I devise all my property of every description to my wife M. Y. Gilghman after my just debts are paid.
