This Agreement made between Alfred Hensley, on the one part
and David Barnett of the other, Witney, that for and in consideration
of the sum of One Hundred Sixty dollars Current
Money of Maryland to be paid in five Annual installments 1833
\$32 per Annum ~~with the interest~~ The said David Barnett
hereby agrees to sell the term of five years services of his Samuel
Benjamin Barnett to the said Alfred Hensley his Heirs & Executors
for the time above mentioned, and the s^d. Alfred Hensley engaged to
find the said Benjamin Barnett good and comfortable lodgings with the
usual allowance of provisions, also clothing such as is generally
made at home, and for the summer two Cotton or linen
shirts & two pair of Trowsers, and it is hereby clearly understood
between the parties that in case of any loss of time on the
part of the said Benjamin Barnett, the s^d. lost time is to be
deducted out of the Annual wages - When into which
set on hand & c^t this first day of Oct Eighteen
hundred & thirty two
