Yours of the 3^d Instant has just come
to hand. & I direct the Contents. - I have to
observe that previous to W. Telfman's going
from home I had an interview with him
& it was agreed that I should accept his order
to the amount of \$100 since which time I had
a letter telling me know that he had drawn
me for \$106. Our Accounts between us is more
settled but I suppose I did not owe him more
than \$100.00 however I would have paid
to the amount which he informed me he had
drawn me for which was \$106. - \$65
has been presented soon after his going away
& has been honored by me the Balance
which is \$35 or \$41 which I would have
paid if order to that amount is presented to
me. is as much as I suppose that I owe W.
Telfman however as no order to a
greater amount than \$65. has as yet
been presented it may be that W. Telfman
wished me to pay the Balance between
\$65 & \$100 to you & so I will send you
\$35 if you wish so say - I am with
