

My dear Madam

Centre Hill June 4<sup>th</sup> 1835.

Your two favours of the 15<sup>th</sup> & 27<sup>th</sup> of April last came duly to hand - The third near approaching Term of our county Court and its subsequent session of two weeks and ~~the~~ <sup>after which</sup> having to attend the Tallot Court, together with a constant press of business and occasional absences from home, in attending the Tallot Court &c has unavoidably delayed until <sup>this time</sup> was a reply to them, at least to the extent required - I have now however the satisfaction of enclosing you the statements desired; The first shows the account Bal owing James Tilyman on the 1<sup>st</sup> day of April last from which however is to be deducted the Bal due, for the hire of his servants for the year 1834 - to be credited & distributed <sup>as</sup> who see. The second is a continuation <sup>of the statement</sup> of our respective claims agt. him and which was by a former statement furnished you, brought down to the 1<sup>st</sup> of March 1833. and the third & last is an Acct current between you & myself; accounting for your dividend of hire since March 1<sup>st</sup> 1833. - These several statements, together with Mr. Grayson's letter of ~~the~~ <sup>the</sup> 1<sup>st</sup> of March last, and <sup>a copy of</sup> mine in reply both of which are herewith sent, and which you will please return to me when ~~so~~ copied or no longer wanted, will furnish
