therewith, and think that I have done right, I therefore be-
queath to my said daughter Juliana Tilghman my silver
Tea & Cream pot and seventy five pounds current money.

Fifthly. I give and bequeath to my son Matthew Tilghman my
Gold watch, all my plate and plated ware, my Household
and kitchen furniture of every kind and sort, (except any small
legacys from the same) And I give to my said son Matthew
Tilghman my negroes Will and Ben who go in the Schooner,
old Maria, Rachael, Eilla, and the boy Frank, and all my
negroes on my Smiths Forest Farm, and those that may be
hired out in that neighbourhood, except and out of which num-
ber I give a few to his sister Anna Maria M^s Price, and
I give my slave Richard to my son Matthew, and request
my said son to pay to the said Richard an annuity of
Twenty Dollars from the first day of January after my
decease, and I request my said son to take good care of
said Richard and to be kind to him. Rich^d Tilghman 4th.
