

Philad June 2 1830

My dear Sir

I wrote to you on the 5th of April - asking information respecting Bramble's claim - He has employed counsel to me on it - Will you favor me with advice respecting this matter?

I have been absent in Jersey on business, and very unexpectedly, as well as to my great inconvenience, I am compelled to start off tomorrow to Luzerne County, where I shall probably be detained for a fortnight from this date - On my return I hope to find a letter from you, which will decide the period of my visit to Maryland in order to wind up our accounts -
