PREVORTIO.

An **ABORTION PREVENTIVE**, for immediate use on appearance of threatening symptoms, or for sterility in consequence of uterine inertia, atony of the cervix, or open *os* generally occurring in cows past middle age, that occasionally skip one or more heats; also for Invertio Vagina. Price \$1.00.

FAILURE TO BREED.

Many animals fail to breed from various causes, such as abortion, retention of the placenta, etc., which usually result in closing of the *os cervicis*. It has been the custom of many persons, in the absence of anything better, to open the *os* by mechanical force; this is accompanied with more or less danger of injury to the parts, and is only temporary relief. Haboriri restores the organs to health, when the *os* will expand, all obstructions are removed, and the animal will breed as naturally as ever. Only three classes of animals are barred, viz.: those whose organs are malformed like most Free Martins, etc.; those who have been mechanically injured, and the parts adhered in consequence, and those of extreme age. In some few cases, generally of animals past middle age, atony and inertia is manifest on examination, and the *os* will be found too open to retain the fœtus even a month; in such cases a few doses of Prevortio will correct this evil. Every breeder should have a bottle of each medicine on hand.

HABITUAL ABORTION.

When Haboriri was first sent out, I supposed it would be used as I had used it, viz.; to commence on an empty slinker, then breed her in from one to three weeks and keep right on with the Haboriri in less frequent doses, as a constitutional remedy for Habitual Abortion, until one entire bottle is used by one animal. It is perfectly proper to commence its use at any time, but I find that too many persons look upon it as a preventive remedy and keep it until symptoms of abortion appear. This is entirely wrong; it is not advertised as a preventive and cannot be expected to act as such, until the system of the cow has been thoroughly permeated, renovated, and a riddance of this weakening disease thereby effected.

In view of this misapprehension, I have put up the **PREVORTIO**, an *Abortion Preventive* for use on short notice, and which may be kept on hand for that purpose. It accomplishes its purpose for the time being, and Haboriri will be needed just the same, to go on with its renovating work. If periodical abortion is expected, its use should commence a week in advance, and be continued in daily doses for three weeks in lieu of Haboriri, the use of which should then be resumed as before.
